# One *More* Thing

# with Fr. Paul Clark

I was recently inspired by the miracle recovery story of that teenage boy in St. Louis, Missouri who fell into a partially frozen lake a few weeks ago. Docs say that he was dead for 45 minutes after having been submerged in the freezing waters for almost 20 minutes.

Upon entering the hospital room of her son (whom the medical professionals were about to officially declare dead), his mother prayed these words aloud: "Holy God send your Holy Spirit to save my son. I want my son, please save him." Within seconds the boy began to revive and had a pulse. Those present say that it was a "bona fide" miracle and that they never saw at St. Joseph's hospital anything like that before. The boy, expected to make just about a full recovery, stated that he knows God has a unique purpose for his life and he will discern what that purpose is.

This is an awesome testimony to the power of prayer that is uttered from the lips and hearts of individuals of faith. The holy season of Lent is a time for more intense personal prayer and reflection on our faith and on God's goodness to us - even the times in our lives and in the lives of others in which He has performed miracles, great and small alike. I pray that this Lent is a time for you to cry out to God in prayer as well as a time to listen more closely to His ever-present voice speaking to you words of peace, healing, and forgiveness.
