On October 19, 2015, more than 150 STMS members and guests, invited dignitaries from all three branches of government, and faithful of the Diocese of Harrisburg gathered at St. Patrick's Cathedral for the 25th annual Red Mass of Central Pennsylvania. Bishop Ronald Gainer was principle celebrant, and Bishop Kevin

Rhoades, Bishop of South Bend-Fort Wayne and a charter member of the STMS, was guest homilist. The Trinity High School Choir provided choral music, adding to the beauty of the liturgy. Also in attendance were a number of charter members of the STMS who were recognized on the occasion of the Society's 25th anniversary.

Bishop Rhoades delivered and inspiring homily in which he reminded those in attendance that the STMS was founded for "the formation of its

members in Christian holiness, after the example of Thomas More, the patron saint of lawyers, statesmen, and politicians." He urged us as legal professionals to make St. Thomas More's priorities our own "in this proper order: God, family, profession."

Bishop Gainer Uses Images of Religious Freedom as a Call to Action

Bishop Ronald Gainer addressed state legislators and other public officials on October 21st at the 2015 legislative breakfast, hosted by the Pennsylvania Catholic Conference and the Pennsylvania Council of the Knights of Columbus. In his keynote address, Bishop Gainer suggested that legislators take notice of the many symbols of religious freedom that are incorporated into the magnificent art and architecture of the state Capitol building, and be mindful of their significance. The Bishop urged legislators to support the cause of religious freedom of those they serve by passing laws that enable people to live out their faith in the public square.
